A) Strengthening intergenerational solidarity & empowering generations: Dialogues across generations for a bright era of longevity

This demographic shift necessitates urgent and comprehensive policy adaptations across various sectors, from social protection to health and technology and disaster risk reduction. The Madrid International Plan of Action on Ageing (MIPAA) and the United Nations Decade of Healthy Ageing provide a framework for addressing these challenges. Centered around the ESCAP repository of policies and good practices on population ageing, this seminar aims to foster peer learning and sharing of experiences to support the development of policies on ageing that align with global, regional, and subregional frameworks and human rights standards.

The objectives of the seminar are to present the latest evidence and mandates on population ageing in Asia and the Pacific, review and obtain feedback on the ESCAP repository of policies and good practices on ageing and discuss considerations and criteria for aligning policies and good practices with international frameworks and country-specific priorities.
